I can remember going there as a family when I was 10-12 years old to visit relatives of my Mom - to plan a "TRIP" like that took more time and effort than an International tour

would take today. of course, we
farmed - so all the time a day
"Making the Cows" had to be planned.

In going through a box of old pictures
I found a snapshot taken at the
funeral of my folks - I could only remember
Mom telling me it was the day of a
funeral of someone from Chicago - and
they had dinner at my Mom + Dad
following the Cemetery. Just this week
I finally happened to look on the back -
and it read -

June 16 - to Uncle Mack + Aunt
Blaisy from Teen and Jim -

So it was following the burial of Ellen -
June 1937 -

I drew that conclusion from the fact my
Mom looked very pregnant in the picture -
and my brother was born Sept. 12 - 1937.

Something that would be really interesting
is what those folks must have thought
about this - I know there was no
electricity - and no indoor plumbing on
our farm at that time. My own kids
are so shocked to believe that we really
had this lifestyle. I always told them
that is why "Going Camping" for a
vacation would be something I would not
even consider. I "Camped" in my early

Childhood - and today, My Camp
Must have "Super 8" over the door.

Hope this information will help
you to complete some of the open
questions - it has been fun doing
it.
