

The application must be accompanied by duplicate unmounted photographs of the applicant, not larger than three by three inches in size, one of which is to be affixed to the passport by the Department.

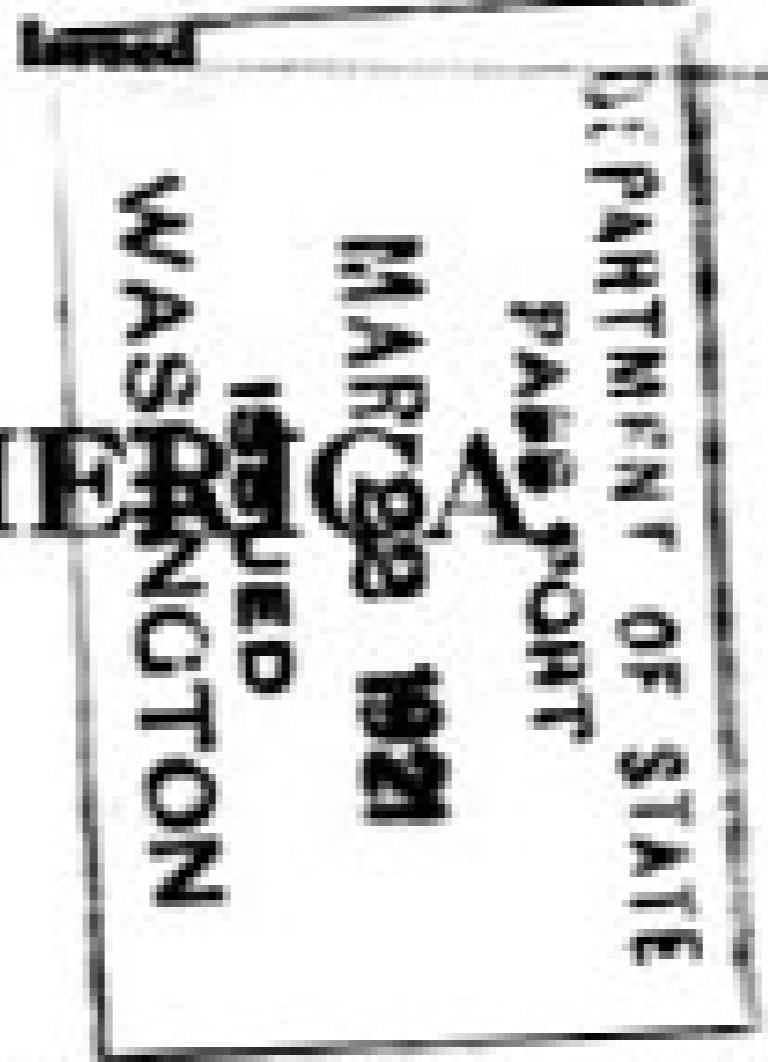

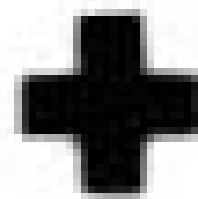
